BEHIND BEEHIVE QUILT SHOP & BEE CREATIVE TOYS

On March 10, 2018, SCEC member **ANNAROSE WHITE** and her mother, **CONNIE HART**, embarked on a heartfelt venture by opening the Beehive Quilt Shop & Bee Creative Toys within the walls of a beautifully renovated JCPenney building. Their shared passion for fabric and quilting blossomed into a vibrant community hub, not just for locals but also for visitors from surrounding rural areas.



The Beehive Quilt Shop is a treasure trove for crafting enthusiasts, offering a wide range of fabrics, long-arm quilting services, notions, patterns, classes, books, and sewing and embroidery machines from Brother. It also features AccuQuilt cutting machines and dyes. But the allure of this establishment doesn't stop at quilting.

Adjacent to the fabric wonders is a wonderland of play — Bee Creative Toys. This section delights the young and young-at-heart with an array of toys spanning from LEGO to Melissa & Doug, Fat Brain Toys, SMART Games, and STEM-related items, alongside puzzles, trains, tractors, stuffed animals and baby gifts.

In February 2022, in response to their growing community of crafters and families, the owners expanded their vision by acquiring "The Hive" — a space a few blocks from their original store designed to accommodate larger workshops and gatherings. This expansion into The Hive enables them to host more attendees and provide The Beehive Quilt Shop is a treasure trove for crafting enthusiasts, offering a wide range of fabrics, long-arm quilting services, notions, patterns, classes, books, and sewing and embroidery machines from Brother.

The Beehive Quilt Shop & Bee Creative Toys is nestled within a historic building that dates to 1910, originally housing Gambrill's Department Store. By 1934, it had become a JCPenney department store, serving the community for most of its life. The restoration of this historic site was a labor of love, deeply infused with the Hart family's dedication to preserving the past while fostering new growth and creativity.

The choice of the name "Beehive Quilt Shop" reflects a deeper connection to Wellington's history and the vital role bees play in our ecosystem. Echoing the legacy of one of Wellington's original businesses, the Beehive Grocery Store, the shop stands as a testament to the industrious and communal spirit of bees, which inspire countless quilts with their beauty and importance to nature.

Through their establishment, Annarose and Connie have created more than a store; they've woven a vibrant tapestry of community, history and creativity that celebrates both the legacy of Wellington and the timeless art of quilting.

Heads Up, Co-op Members!

Your May statement has important news!

Keep an eye on the IMPORTANT MESSAGES SECTION of your May billing statement from Sumner-Cowley Electric Co-op. A special notice regarding your capital credits allocation for 2023 awaits you! Our cooperative's principle of operating at cost means any margins are returned to members, like you, through capital credits.

Look out for this vital update on your May statement, mailing on May 6. It outlines the amount of capital credits you've earned throughout 2023 as a valued member of our cooperative.

To calculate your capital credits allocation simply add up your total patronage for 2023 and multiply it by the allocation factor for the respective rate on your account.

For example, a residential customer

having \$2,000 in total patronage would receive an allocation of \$102.86 (\$2,000 x 0.05142872).
